## Community update on water and wastewater works

April 2026

Significant water and wastewater upgrade works continue to make steady progress with more than half of the planned assets for Adelaide's northern suburbs now installed. As parts of the network are completed, we've begun progressively bringing some sections online to support our growing system and this edition highlights what you need to know about potential changes to your water as new assets are switched on.

These upgrades play an important role in supporting existing residents and the thousands of new homes planned for the area, helping to ensure our water and wastewater networks remain reliable, resilient and ready for the future.

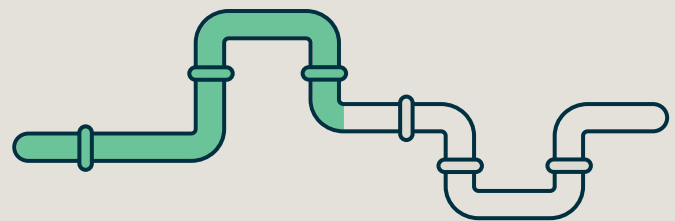
We've also made important progress in strengthening the regional wastewater system for Roseworthy area, with four large emergency wastewater storage tanks successfully installed at the new Roseworthy pump station site.

Thank you for your ongoing patience as we deliver this essential work. Each milestone brings us closer to a stronger water and wastewater network that will support the community for decades to come.



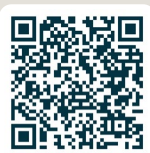
### Progress

# Temporary changes to your water services

The first of two new major water pipe alignments have been successfully brought online, providing more reliable water services for the local community and supporting housing growth at Riverlea Park. This includes approximately 5,400 metres of new water mains installed across Elizabeth North, Davoren Park and Virginia.

Over the coming months we'll prepare to progressively switch on additional new water pipes installed under Curtis Road and Craigmore Road, as well as along the alignment from Gawler East to Concordia and Kingsford to Roseworthy.

While final checks and commissioning activities are underway, some residents may notice occasional, temporary changes such as slightly lower water pressure or minor fluctuations. These impacts are intermittent and wherever possible works will be scheduled outside peak-use times to minimise disruptions. During this time some customers may notice short periods of discoloured water caused by fine sediment being stirred within the pipes as water movement changes and systems are refilled. This is a normal occurrence, and your water remains safe to drink. Running your outside taps for a few minutes can help clear the discolouration.

### Andrews Road and Angle Vale Road

Intermittent day and night works for wastewater pipe installation continue along Angle Vale Road, Munno Para Downs until mid-2026.

Night and day works for wastewater pipe installation continue along Andrews Road until mid-2026.

### Angle Vale

Night works and intermittent day works for wastewater pipe installation and pump station upgrades on Heaslip Road and Curtis Road are continuing along Curtis Road, between Heaslip Road and Andrews Road (Angle Vale to Munno Para West), until mid-2026.

### Buckland Park

In late-March wastewater pipe installation began on Brooks Road near Symes Road and move progressively north, with completion expected mid-2027.

## Blakeview - Munno Para West (Craigmore Road and Curtis Road)

From April until mid- 2026 works will occur to prepare to turn on the new water pipe located from the Craigmore and Adams roads intersection through to the Curtis Road and Leicester Grove intersection. Some localised road closures will be in place.

Night works and occasional day works for water/wastewater pipe installation are continuing along Curtis Road between Stebonheath Road and Andrews Road until mid-2026. Additional crews are working in this area to fast-track works.

Night works and intermittent day works for wastewater pipe installation and pump station upgrades on Heaslip Road and Curtis Road, between Heaslip Road and Andrews Road (Angle Vale to Munno Para West), until mid-2026.

## Gawler East, Gawler Belt and Concordia

Wastewater pipe installation continues along Paternoster Road, Reid until mid to late 2026.

Service access points are being installed along Twartz Road and Kentish Road until mid-2026.

Pump station construction is ongoing.

Wastewater pipe and service access points being installed under the Gawler Aerodrome and Northern Expressway will continue until mid-2026.

Further works along the water pipe route on Martin Road and Sunnysdale Road will continue until May 2026.

Works for the replacement of the water booster pump station at the corner of Concordia Road and Barossa Valley Way until mid-2027.

## Kingsford

Water pipe installation near the Bruce Eastick North Para Flood Control Dam, heading south towards the Sturt Highway until mid-2026.

## McDonald Park - Robert Road and Eyre - Petherton Road

Pipe installation has started on Petherton Road and will continue until late 2026.

Pipe installation on Roberts Road will continue between Short Road and the Northern Expressway until mid-2026.

## Sandy Creek

Tank construction is continuing until mid-2026. Additional works will occur on Saturdays between 7am and 5pm.

**Dates are subject to change based on program requirements and weather conditions.**

## What to expect

- Most works will take place Mondays to Fridays from 6am to 5pm and on some Saturdays.
- Minor delays, traffic changes and detours, and some noise, vibration and dust.
- Some night works.

# Infrastructure upgrades take shape

A major wastewater upgrade is taking shape, with four large emergency storage tanks installed at a new wastewater pump station site in Roseworthy. This milestone marks an important step toward strengthening the local wastewater network as the community grows.

Each tank can hold 108,000 litres which is equivalent to more than two average swimming pools and will provide vital backup storage if the pump station temporarily stops operating due to power outages, mechanical issues, or other unexpected events. This added capacity gives maintenance crews time to respond, helping prevent overflows and protect nearby areas.

The upgraded system will support around 3,800 new homes, improving reliability for existing customers while creating capacity for future development. The project also includes new wastewater pipelines and maintenance access points to improve how wastewater flows through the network.

With the tanks now in place, construction will continue on the remaining pump station works and network connections.
