If you do, your name and email address will be used by project team officers and the WAPC to email you the updates (for example, details of the WAPC determination meeting and its outcome).</p> <p>In addition, a summary of all submitters' responses (not names and contact details) will be shared with the:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WAPC / Project Team • Applicant • Relevant Local Government Authority (LGA) <p>The summary will also be published in the WAPC agenda when the application is determined.</p>
Secondary purposes	<p>If you agree to it by selecting the relevant tick-box, you will also be notified about the date and details of the WAPC determination meeting and its outcome. In addition, if the application is approved and there are any future amendment applications that are to be publicly advertised, you will be offered the opportunity to make comment on the proposed amendment.</p>
What would happen if we do not collect your personal information?	<p>Your feedback will not be able to be included in the collated community feedback which shows submitters' support, opposition and/or suggested modifications to the proposed development.</p>
