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## Regional Context of Noxious Weed and Pest Animal Management

Wellington Shire is located in Central Gippsland in eastern Victoria and has an area of 10,924 square kilometres. It has an extremely diverse array of landforms including large areas of mountainous Crown Land in the north, heavily forested country in the Strzelecki Ranges, fertile flood plains with higher intensity irrigated agriculture through the central parts of the Shire, and generally lower intensity agriculture on the sandy plains stretching across the southern area. The Shire also boasts highly valued coastal, lakes and wetlands ecosystems such as the western extent of the Gippsland Lakes, the 90 Mile Beach coastline, and the Nooramunga Marine and Coastal Park. Each of these areas have their own set of environmental, social and economic values that need to be taken into consideration when planning for weed and pest control.

Wellington Shire Council is responsible for the management of approximately 3,100km of local road network and is dedicated to managing pest infestations on Council managed land. Since 2012/13, Council has implemented the strategic and targeted Roadside Weed and Rabbit Control Plan, successfully partnering with numerous key stakeholders including:

- DPI/DEDJTR lead programs for Serrated Tussock, Rabbits, Prickly Pear, Flax-leaved Broom, Gorse
- Landcare – Blackberries, Chilean Needle-grass, African Lovegrass
- Red Gum Plains and Coastal Hinterland Invasive Weeds Group – African Lovegrass
- Wellington Blackberry Taskforce – Blackberries
- Parks Victoria – Blackberries, Thistles, Ox-eye Daisy, African Boxthorn

This plan has been developed with the overall objective of consolidating and furthering the partnerships and on-ground achievements of past control works, and also updated to include new initiatives and projects that have developed during the lead up to renewing the plan for the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons.

## Community Consultation

The Wellington Shire Council Land and Natural Resources Coordinator stays in close touch with community concerns through regular contact with a wide variety of stakeholders in both formalised and impromptu meetings, including Landcare networks, several weed focused community groups, Greening Australia and Trust for Nature staff, Parks Victoria rangers, and Department of Economic Development Jobs Transport Resources officers.

Key stakeholders have been requested to provide input to the development of this plan by nominating priority weed species and locations for roadside weed control to complement and support their projects and initiatives. Formal responses received are recorded in Council's electronic correspondence register.

Council's Land Projects Officer also fields customer enquiries and requests for weed control. Customer Requests provide an insight to the broader community's views and opinions about what weeds are of concern in different locations across the Shire.

Much of the information required to develop this plan had already been obtained over preceding years through engagement of key stakeholders and the community whilst implementing Council's previous Roadside Weed and Pest Plan. The objectives and priorities of the previous plan were broadly accepted, and more recent feedback from stakeholders has been used to update and refine this new plan to ensure relevance for the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons.

## Objectives of the Plan

Contribute to the Shire's ongoing roadside weed and rabbit management program and complement past investments made by Wellington Shire Council enabled through State Government initiative funding. Assist with preventing the spread and introduction of invasive plant and animal species across the Shire and the region as a whole.

Consolidate and further develop the partnerships and on-ground achievements of control works associated with previous years Roadside Weed and Pest Plan investments.

Wellington Shire Council's overall roadside weed and rabbit management objective is the effective and proactive management of invasive species on Council managed roadsides across the Shire. Investment of funds will be aligned to:

1. Treatment for the eradication of Regionally Prohibited Weed infestations.
2. Treatment for the containment or reduction in area infestations of Regionally Controlled Weeds and rabbits – aligned to DEDJTR weed and rabbit compliance project area.
3. Supporting community group investment in weed and pest control projects.
4. Contributing to other previous investment in the control of Regionally Controlled and Regionally Prohibited Weeds and rabbits.
5. Protect identified assets such as significant roadside vegetation under threat from weed invasion or other significant roadside infrastructure.
6. Support weed and pest animal management programs being undertaken by land owners.
7. Addressing other roadside declared noxious weed infestations of concern to the Shire's community including Restricted Weeds declared under the Catchment and Land Protection Act 1994 (CaLP Act). For example, lower profile Regionally Controlled and Restricted weeds (including Chilean Needle-grass, Thistles, Broom, Bridal Creeper, Ox-eye Daisy, Paterson's Curse, St John's Wort, Greater Mullein) that are not part of any formal program or community driven control effort.

Wellington Shire Council has also identified a potential need to address high threat environmental weeds for the protection of significant roadside vegetation. Any works for control of environmental weeds (such as Radiata Pine, Blue Bell Creeper, Japanese Honeysuckle, Blue Perriwinkle, Briar Rose) will be funded exclusively through Wellington Shire Council's co-contribution and will not impact on the effective delivery of State Government funded priorities.
