



Claisebrook Cove Jetty Structures

A City of Perth survey was undertaken to seek the community's aspirations for the jetty structures at Claisebrook Cove. The community were asked about their use of the existing jetties and what infrastructure they would like in the future.

The results of the survey will help inform the 'Jetty Feasibility Study' for Claisebrook Cove, a preliminary exploration of options to improve the jetty structures. The Jetty Feasibility Study is a deliverable of the City's Claisebrook Cove Public Realm Rectification Plan. The survey was posted on Engage Perth from 17 February to 3 March 2023 and we received a total of **180 responses**.

It would be great to have a place to dock and launch our kayaks


I would like to see floating jetties as they provide access to people of all abilities



TYPE OF CRAFT


What type of craft people want the jetty structures to accommodate
