We want your views to inform the revision of the existing Masterplan for this botanic garden.

What's happening?

We are looking for your ideas about how to enhance the experience and amenities for visitors to the Mount Lofty Botanic Garden, while maintaining a site for horticultural excellence in growing, displaying and conserving plants.

In particular we are looking for your feedback on a number of ideas that we believe will improve the visitor experience. Your views will help inform whether or not these concepts are included in the Masterplan revisions.

The Masterplan is a planning document that will help guide future infrastructure investment in the site.

Proposed changes being considered for inclusion in the revised Masterplan include:

- a new visitor and educational hub
- additional on-site and overflow car parking, new public toilets, drinking fountains
- improved way-finding signage
- a new horticulture and conservation hub
- upgraded walking trails.

The map overleaf shows potential locations for the visitor centre, horticulture and conservation hub, and new visitor car-parking.
