

Hosting a conversation

1. ADVICE ON LEADING YOUR OWN CONVERSATIONS

There are two tools for you to use:

- 1. The online survey https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/resilienceblueprint
- 2. Simplified survey questions (below) for over the phone, face to face or for people to write their own responses.

Start by explaining what the Blueprint for a Resilient South East NSW is and where the survey fits in its development. You can refer to the attached project summary flyer and timeline.

The survey results will directly feed into the development stage of the Blueprint. Thinking about the changing climate, it is asking for three things:

- 1. What are the most important things to protect?
- 2. What are the personal and community challenges in preventing, preparing, responding, and recovering?
- 3. What actions are you and your community already undertaking and what supports or changes are needed?

They can stay up to date with the project by going to their council websites, or contacting the CRJO directly at blueprint@crjo.nsw.gov.au. They need to provide their contact details if they want to be included in mailing lists about the project.

2. SUGGESTED AGENDA (45 MINUTES)

- 1. Welcome everyone & Acknowledgment of Country (5 mins)
- 2. Information about the Resilience Blueprint project. Provide the Blueprint project one pager and timeline. (5 mins)
- 3. Ice breaker Ask the first question **What does resilience mean to you?** Take some individual thinking time. Ask them to write it in the first section of the survey and then share to the group. (15 mins)

Before getting into the survey questions, take a few minutes to think about:

- What are the most important things to protect?
- What personal and community challenges in preventing, preparing, responding, and recovering?
- What actions are you and your community already undertaking and what supports, or changes are needed?

Take some individual thinking time and then discuss survey as a group (5 min).

- 4. Complete the survey (15 mins) Ways to submit your group's responses are highlighted on the previous page.
- 5. Thank-you and don't forget to add in your contact details if you would like to stay involved in the project.
